The new 0.07 acre area has no suitable habitat for the federally protected Georgia rockress or red-cockaded woodpecker, or the state protected broadstripe shiner. Scientists conducted a 100 percent survey of the 0.07 acre area for the gopher tortoise and/or its burrows and none where identified and there were no observations of any commensal species.

At this time Sabal Trail requests the USFWS confirm that the incorporation of the Earthern Dam Workspace Modifications are addressed by the February 25, 2016 Biological Opinion.
