The fiscal year 2025 LRA formula amount for Lowndes County is \$1,677,028.92.

SUBJECT: Undated Debris Removal Contract Pricing with Ashbritt

HISTORY, FACTS AND ISSUES:

On June 25, 2024, the Lowndes County Board of Commissioners approved AshBritt Environmental as the County's primary disaster-related debris removal contractor and authorized the Chairman to sign an agreement, including their pricing proposal. Under the terms of the agreement, AshBritt is permitted to request annual pricing adjustments on the anniversary of the contract renewal. Any adjustments are to be based on the Consumer Price Index (CPI) published by the U.S. Department of Labor for the South Region, which includes Lowndes County.

AshBritt has submitted an updated pricing list reflecting a 1.9% increase, consistent with the most recent CPI published for the South Region. If the Board of Commissioners wishes to renew the agreement with AshBritt, the updated pricing list would take effect as of the contract renewal date, June 25, 2025.

OPTIONS: 1. Authorize renewal of the contract with Ashbritt for an additional one year term, to include the updated pricing schedule.
